Lent Appreciation

The Companion Congregation Team would like to say a big "THANK YOU" to all of the teams that provided soups, rolls and breads, and desserts for the Lenten soup suppers this year. They were a great success as usual. The thank you also goes to all of the people who came to enjoy the soups and companionship. I think almost everyone stayed for the Lenten church service afterwards. We have had the soup suppers for at least 9 years, missing half of 2020 and all of 2021 due to COVID.

The teams were the Companion Congregation, Church Council, Praise Team, Preschool and Governing Board, SPY, and Wedded Band. There were probably about 100 people who were part of providing for the events. It was wonderful that all of the teams were willing to wash the soup bowls, silverware, and coffee cup rather than put more paper and plastic in the landfill. What a fantastic effort by so many of our members.

The teams made about 80 gallons of soup. This served approximately 470 people with 600 bowls of soup during the 6 events. In addition there were about 60 bowls of soup for take-out or delivered to people who were not able to attend but were able to enjoy some of the great soups. If you missed out on the "stone soup," you missed out on a great surprise.

The free will offerings totaled \$2405.00 for the 6 events. The money will go to Tanzania to our companion congregation in Kidugala. One third of the money will be designated to go to the local SACCOS (Savings and Credit Cooperative Society) and another third to go to the local AMSOS (Agricultural Marketing Cooperative Societies). The remaining third will go to the Igumbilo Girls School for scholarships. I hope you took time to read some of the information about these groups that was on each of the tables.

Pastor's Tower Talk Article For April 2024

Thank you to everyone who attended a visioning session. I really enjoyed the conversations that we had and look forward to the next steps. If you weren't able to attend a session, please know that the council is working on next steps. There will be more ways for you to offer feedback, continue to pray, and continue to dream about how God is moving within, and around, St. Paul's.

I took some time after the session to compile the data that we received and want to share so things that struck me.

We began by sharing stories. These included stories of strong leaders, strong community, embracing each other, and keeping God as the center rose to the top. Many people lifted up the strength of having many young people involved in the congregation and the ways we care for people in need. At the same time, there were questions of: how do we grow deeper in understanding of God and the Bible; how do we keep church a priority with all the competing things in our world; what does it mean to be a healthy congregation. People wondering how we move forward. They said we're at a crossroads. How do we learn from the past, but also move forward as a church? How is the church, and St. Paul's specifically, relevant in today's world?

Many of these stories were echoed in the values people listed. Groups chose youth/young adults/children, caring, serving, discipleships, engaging neighbors, and intergenerational as *some* of the present values. They hoped to focus on inclusivity, diversity, raising leaders, evangelism, and innovation as *some* of the future values. One thing that came up over and over was a desire for intergenerational ministry. I have loved how the congregation has embraced intentional, intergenerational things we've done this past year, and I look forward to how God might continue to call us into this work.

We closed our visioning sessions, but asking people to write down the things of this world that tug at their hearts. When our youth participated in a visioning session, they also wrote down items and I was struck by their deep care and concern for the world. They see so many struggles and want to find ways to bring about help and healing. Many of the items listed had to do with hurting people and broken relationships. There was concern for people who lack basic needs such as housing. Many people listed loneliness, political strain, or mental health.

And so, I wonder, how do we move forward from here? What would you choose as important values for St. Paul's? What stories would you share of God showing up in the church and the world? How is God calling you to make a difference in the world? Feel free to reach out to me or the council to share your thoughts. Join me in praying for the next steps of this process and how God might lead us.



The BLHS Auxiliary purpose is "to promote love in action, to assist with leisure time activities and projects, and to promote volunteer services at the Home and the Heights by serving in areas that otherwise would require paid staff." The Auxiliary meets four times a year on the second Monday of the month in January, April, July, and October. Eight supporting churches help with monthly birthday parties and twice a month bingo at the Home and provide treats for these events. The July meeting is at the Heights with pie and bingo. Churches have also contributed items for the General Store and the Christmas Store and candy for Halloween. The Auxiliary organized an Ice Cream Social on July 30 and provided pies, cakes and ice cream for residents, staff, and families. Women from the churches are making dignity bags for the residents. The beginning balance January 2023 was \$8,632.45. There were deposits of \$2,524.62 and disbursements of \$1779.32. Giving a balance at the end of 2023 of \$9,377.75.



- † Added 50 lbs. of softener salt to the church water softener.
- † Put a concrete screw in some office raceway because it was not sticking with the tape.
- † Installed 4 door stops to protect the walls from door handle damage.
- **†** Ken re-stained some of the pews in the sanctuary, plans to do more.
- **†** Ken glued some to the laminate coming loose under the altar flower bases.
- † Put the US and Christian flags back on the standards after they were dry cleaned.
- † Raked the leaves away from the back fence and mulched them with the riding mower.
- † Picked up those leaves and some along the preschool fence with the lawn sweep.
- † Put them all in a big 4 ft X 4 ft X 4 ft bag, and Mike took them home to his burn area.
- † Picked up sticks that were scattered around the lawn after some bad winds.
- † Put poison worms in many of the mole runs in hopes to control them.
- † Cleaned the heat pump fins even though they were not very dirty.



Other tasks performed since the last Tower Talk update includes:

- † Ken and Coretta have been taking the recycle cardboard, paper, and plastic to the recycle center. There seems to be a lot lately which says we are doing a good job of keeping recyclables out of the landfill.
- † Cleared some of the snow from sidewalks and part of the parking lot before preschool started one morning.
- † Have been unlocking the sanctuary every morning before 7:00 a.m. in case the painters come to paint the trim.
- † Replace the fill valve in upstairs bathroom toilet. It was taking a long time to fill.
- † Tightened the bolts holding the women's bathroom west toilet to keep it from moving on the floor.
- † Put a paper "shade" on the north entry motion light switch to allow it to turn on when it is bright outside.
- † Changed some of the clocks to daylight savings time. Some change themselves.
- † Burned the sticks in the burn ring.
- † Removed the posts that were supporting the new trees planted several years ago.
- † Spread crabgrass preventer/fertilizer on all of the church property except the preschool ground.
- † Fixed the lid on the dumpster that we tried to fix several other times. Jerry Lustgraaf did the welding.
- † Kirk spent 6 hours in the entry attic attaching chicken wire to the ceiling joist to hold up old insulation.
- † Doug set the door lock timer to daylight savings time.
- † Kirk is checking on the painting progress daily to make sure they are doing some of the things we asked them to do.
- T Ken re-stained more of the pews in the sanctuary, plans to do even more.
