The quarterly Bethany Lutheran Health Services Auxiliary met January 10 at the Bethany Heights community room. Cece Mickells, spiritual advisor, installed these officers for 2022: Rose Hansen, St. John Lutheran, Council Bluffs, as secretary; Sylvia Lilly, St. John Lutheran, Mineola, vice president; and Norma Vorthmann, St. Paul Lutheran, Treynor, president. Unable to attend was Carol Jeppesen, Our Savior's, Council Bluffs, who will serve at treasurer. Members from six supporting churches were represented. Several members were absent due to illness. Currently there are 99 residents at the Home and 57 residents at the Heights. Visitors are allowed at the Heights but they must wear a mask and go directly to the apartment of the community member. At the Home visitors must also wear a mask and sign in. For the past year there has been a three person management of BLHS. JR Moss oversees the Home, Angie Wagner serves as manager of the Heights and Mike Vaughn is the financial officer. "Above all these, put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony" (Colossians 3:14)



Valentine's Day comes as a bright spot in the middle of a drab and dreary month. The non-stop festivities of the Christmas season are long past. The realities of bills to be paid and taxes to be prepared weigh upon us. Even the overcast days contribute to the sense of dullness that pervades this month. And then, in the middle comes Valentine's Day!

Lift Update

On January 20th the maintenance team, along with Mark and Joe Sornson, met with Adam Denio of Access Elevator and Lifts (AEL) at St. Paul. The purpose of the meeting was to show Adam the completed concrete work and to go over the details for the layout and construction of the lift shaft way. We wanted to verify our understanding of the construction requirements and to make sure we weren't overlooking something. Having Adam here to see our specific situation and challenges was important to get all the information pulled together. As mentioned in last month's update, AEL must approve our completed shaft way before the lift is ordered. Working on the shaft way is the priority but we will also be starting the work in the area beyond the shaft way in the basement. That will include the work in the old restroom and old quilt room. Some wood framing and drywall work is necessary and we will add a new door from the quilt room to the fellowship hall for access to/from the lift. A new wall will be added in the quilt room to divide it into a corridor for access to the lift and a separate area for storage of the tables. We'll also be installing a suspended ceiling in the corridor and old restroom. Before the project is completed carpet squares will be installed to finish the floor in the access area from the fellowship hall to the lift. More updates next month.

The family that has been renting the parsonage will be moving out at the end of January. The parsonage will be posted again and will be available mid February on a 3 month lease to have a month to month option after that.

The lift concrete work has now been completed and the next step will be to start framing.

Dave made a motion to adjourn the meeting. JJ seconded. The motion passed.

With no other business the meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Happy 72nd Anniversary Wedded Band!

On January 24, 2022, Wedded Band had their 72nd anniversary! We are blessed to have two charter members still with us, Roland Burger and Herb Sudmann. Wedded Band was created to "bind the young married folks into a closer fellowship." That certainly worked because those young couples stayed together, along with many later additions, to keep Wedded Band going for these 72 years. Along with fellowship, the purpose of Wedded Band includes projects in support of St. Paul and the church's work in general. The first project was a movie projector. In 1953 the Nativity scene was created, and more figures were added in 1954. As you know that Nativity scene is still in use. The annual spaghetti dinner is the major fund raiser and helps support the various mission-related activities that Wedded Band contributes to. Our monthly meetings include various speakers and topics along with fun activities like bingo, museum visits and going out to eat at Pizza King. There are no age restrictions, and you don't have to be married to be part of the group. We have monthly meetings (except May and December) generally on the last Sunday of the month at 6pm with speakers covering everything from creating metal art to information about human trafficking or a mission trip to China. We also provide financial support to youth activities, have donated money for digging water wells in Africa and donated to support missionary work. Our business meetings (held as part of our monthly meeting) can be entertaining – our group has been known to be sort of like trying to herd cats. The regular meetings also include a light meal served by the members. Our working mission statement is: "Meet for fun and fellowship, and to serve the Lord through our projects and service to others." Our meetings are always open to anyone who wants to attend!

Stewardship News!





Greetings from the Stewardship Team:

Again, this year we are going to have the congregation write a message on a valentine that we will deliver to residents of, Bethany Lutheran Home, Risen Son and Oakland Manor. The Sunday School, Preschool, CREW and the confirmation class are also participating in this activity. The residents really enjoy receiving them, especially the ones made by the youth.

Our mission support for February is going to the Open Door Mission located at 2828 No. 23rd Street, Omaha. Open Door Mission is a Gospel Rescue Mission founded in 1954 committed to breaking the cycle of homelessness and poverty. Open Door Mission's campus offers 917 safe, shelter beds to people experiencing homelessness. They serve over 3500 nutritious meals to feed the hungry and provides homeless preventive resources to more than 1,000 people living in poverty to empower them to remain in their homes.

Open Door Mission is our February Mission:

This is a very familiar name to members of St. Paul members as we have collected warm clothes for them, donated food and cash donations from VBS, and our confirmation and high school have served there many times. Open Door Mission to help clothe the homeless of the Council Bluffs/ Omaha area. Many members are also familiar with Lydia House which is branch of the Open Door Mission which supplies help for homeless women and families.

The Open Door Mission also has other branches which aid those men, women, and children in need. One of those programs is the Life-Changing Program. It is designed to break the cycle of homelessness and poverty. Lydia House and the Garland Thompson Men's Center offer life-changing recovery programs to address the causes of homelessness such as abuse, addiction, or the inability to obtain and maintain steady employment.

The New Life Recovery Program (NLRP) is another of the Open Door Mission programs. It is a Bible-based 12 step residential program that is committed to providing men, women, and families with the tools needed to become self—sufficient, contributing members of the community.

The Journey to Work Program focuses on breaking the cycle of homelessness and poverty that many experience. Through personal development, money management, job training and educational skills, people learn to break this cycle. Graduate Equivalency Diploma classes are also offered. Education is often the key to breaking the cycle.

The Veteran's Housing First Program focuses on the Veterans Administration combined goals of crisis intervention, emergency service, screening, and assessments in areas of mental health, chemical dependency, job skills, and training and life skills.

In order to assure that those in need are able to obtain gainful employment a program called Work Net also exists. Graduates of this program discover opportunities that are fulfilling and lead to employment.

Not all of the programs under the Open Door Mission are for the adults. They also offer afterschool programs to provide educational tutoring, field trips, and character building exercises. During the summer Kids to Kamp programs provide 3 hot nutritious meals, recreational activities, field trips, learning activities, educational tutoring, arts, crafts, and much more.

Our support of the Open Door Mission helps many people who are homeless in the Omaha and Council Bluffs area. Statistics tell us that about 2,000 people are homeless in the Omaha metro area. The Open Door Mission provided 189,000 nights of safe shelter, service 1.3 million nutritious meals to the hungry, helped 40,069 individuals to remain in the own homes, celebrated 47 graduates from the life-changing programs, cared for 300 homeless patients in the Free Health and Healing Clinic.

Moved items from quilting room to subbasement


Pulled nails from the old door and wall trim (out the back) with vise grips. Will probably use this when we put in a new door and hallway for access to the new lift


