



Tower talk March 2018



This past year has, sadly, seen many of our older members pass away. As a pastor, even though I get to proclaim a message of hope, doing a funeral is one of the saddest things I do. It affects not only family but the entire community! The time can be made much easier for the deceased's family, however, if they had pre-planned their funeral. This month I'd like to talk about pre-planning your own funeral so that your family doesn't have to make all those decisions while they are grieving. We will focus on the funeral service as that is my area of expertise, but there are other aspects of having someone die that we'll mention as well.

Some people might think that thinking about your funeral well before you die can be weird, or uncomfortable, or egotistical, or something else that makes them not want to do it. However I can tell you from personal experience as a pastor that having your arrangements in order can be a great relief on your family when that time comes. I knew a man we'll call Arnold who, along with his wife, had made arrangements with the funeral home to not only have their funerals completely paid for, but had the services planned out as well. Knowing that their loved ones had not only taken care of the financial arrangements but also chosen what they wanted their services to look like let Arnold's family grieve without having to come up with those things on their own.

So what kind of things can you pre-plan for your funeral? From the pastor's point of view there are a number of things you can choose beforehand. Since most funerals have some sort of music in them, that's a good place to start. You can de-

cide if the congregation will sing any hymns/songs or if you only want a musician to sing; who the singer(s) may be; who will provide the music during the service, for example a pianist; you can even decide which songs will be played/sang at your funeral. If you have your funeral at a church it is appropriate for the songs you choose to be religious in nature, so having your family walk in to "Magic Carpet Ride" would be a bit unsuitable.

Christian funerals also feature readings, primarily Biblical scripture. This is another time you can make choices that will save your family the trouble of trying to figure out what you'd like. You can use your favorite reading that you've loved for years, or you can pick one that speaks to life and death. You can choose a reading that is popular or one that is relatively unknown. The Bible is a big book, and it has lots of good stuff in it! Whatever you decide, it is fitting to have ideas ready for planning your service. Also acceptable as far as readings are poems that fit the situation.

Stop in on Wednesday mornings, Pastor Chuck would love to visit with you! Or call the church office to make an appointment to see Pastor at 487-3880.

You can always make other requests as well. Whether or not you want a eulogy by family or friends is an option. If you want flowers at the service or would rather people give toward a memorial in lieu of flowers is another. (We're not going to do fireworks in the sanctuary though, no matter what you say!) Of course for someone who served in the military there are a number of ideas as well. Whatever you may choose, having your wishes laid out for your family is something you can do to not only make your wishes known, but can be a closing act of service as well.

You can tell your wishes for your service in a few ways: the funeral home can take those notes with you and then will inform the family and church; you can sit down with your pastor and go through your thoughts; or you can write them down by yourself and make sure your family knows where they are--just be sure you tell them! One final note: I know that many if not all funeral homes will allow someone to prepay funeral expenses; this is what Arnold and his wife did. There are a number of details about this I'm sure I'm not familiar with and so didn't want to give bad info on. If you're curious about this, ask your funeral home for more information!

Mosaic of Southwest Iowa

The March mission is Mosaic of Southwest Iowa. Mosaic advocates for person with intellectual disabilities and provides them with opportunities to lead full lives. They often help provide housing, caregivers, and find meaningful opportunities for volunteering or jobs.

Mosaic is a faith-based organization that believes every individual is a person of worth. They provide services that are personalized to the individuals wants and needs.

During Bible School last summer, the Mosiac group from Logan visited. They sent adults and persons with intellectual disabilities to visit. They brought with them many activities for the bible school that helped adults and children relate to how it would be to function in our world if we did not have all our abilities.

The students learned that people with intellectual disabilities have hopes and dreams like everyone else and enjoy being a useful part of society.

Mosaic has offices in Denison, Logan, and Council Bluffs, Iowa as well as Omaha, Nebraska.

Vital Congregations This story is entitled "We Sustain Each Other".

At 109 years old, St. Paul Evangelical Lutheran Church in Baltimore had deep roots in the community but was in danger of closing. The congregation's unstable situation was akin to many others in southeast Baltimore in 2009, the year Mark Parker, the current pastor, arrived. At the time there were approximately 25 to 30 commuter members.

Parker said it was their synod's director for evangelical mission that suggested rapidly transforming the congregation by focusing on the surrounding community. This changed St. Paul into what is now known as Breath of God Lutheran Church.

"A congregation in decline in terms of numbers and energy and people has a really hard time reversing that because you need resources in order to do different things," Parker said. "Each year [The new –start funds] gave us room to grow without a sense of scarcity or anxiety it could all fall apart next month because we couldn't pay the bills."

Breath of God is in an area that is rich in diversity: "This neighborhood has a lot of young professionals moving to it, but it also has a lot of working class people and poor people, a big burgeoning Hispanic population, and refugees," said member Mary MacDonald. "This church is where all those different groups come together."

In order to grow, the congregation began to shift its focus outward to its surrounding neighborhood.

"We do a lot more community outreach than did in the last 25 years," said longtime member on Burk. "The building is used every day of the week."

The new direction invigorated current members and began attracting new ones.

"I felt inspired in a way where I haven't felt before from a church," said member Jennifer Pruitt. "I wanted to find ways to be a better person, to be more open, to be a better community member."

The change in focus would not have been possible were it not for the funds Breath of God received through Mission Support, according to Parker. At the same time, they contribute between 10 and 12 percent of their annual offerings to Mission Support. "It is interesting because we give Mission Support and then we're getting it back," he said. "That's how the church works; we sustain each other. The point of the church is to gather people together, to be nurtured around the work and table of God and to be sent into the world to be on some use to our neighbors and not in small ways but in big transformative ways."
