#### **TAILWINDS**

Iowa is famous for blowing winds, but even so, this spring is definitely setting some records for the speed of the winds and the sustained strength they have maintained. I saw that a track meet was taking place on the "Treynor oval" when I was leaving one evening and wondered if the wind was impacting the races or times.

It's really fun to run with the wind at your back. There is such a feeling of power and a sense of getting somewhere – fast! But what about the times when you are running into a headwind and you fell like you are barely moving? Then it is just plain hard work. Those are the times you wonder why you ever went out for track in the first place. You wonder if it was worth all that time and effort. You are tempted to quit. Your only consolation is that everyone else is struggling right along with you.

It is easy to give up in the face of difficulty. This is true not only in running, but also in life. When things are going well, we're always looking for new challenges. But when things go wrong or don't seem to be going at all, we wonder if it's worth it.

We get discouraged in our Christian faith too. Sometimes it feels futile and hopeless to keep on trusting Jesus when everything seems to be falling apart around us. It is to times and situations like this that the author of Hebrews speaks the word perseverance.

Perseverance means to keep going. Once a race has begun, you keep heading for the finish line. No matter what distractions occur along the sidelines or whether you stumble or feel pain, you keep going on. Even if you are running into the wind and feel like you're standing still, you press on. In practices, coaches want you to press your limits to increase your strength and endurance and build you up. It may feel like they are trying to destroy you, but on the day of the meet, all the hard work pays off.

Sometimes in life, we feel like we are running in place. We feel as if obstacles and opposition have completely stopped us or caused us to go backwards. Yet often, these are the situations God uses to build our faith and to strengthen us. They are hard to face, but as we keep looking to Jesus, keeping our eyes fixed on him, we are able to persevere and keep running the race.

The race is different for each one of us, with different strategies, but God works individually in us to prepare to ruin it. And sometimes, just when we least expect it, the wind of the Spirit blows behind us in a blessed tailwind, enabling us to run as we have never run before!

## Thank you from the Companion Congregation Team

The Companion Congregation Team wants to thank everyone for supporting their Lenten Soup Suppers! It was so nice to get back to normal during Lent and gather for great food and fellowship! A special thank you to all the ministry teams who hosted each week and provided many wonderful soups, breads and desserts. Thank you also for saving waste by using the church's soup bowls and silverware instead of paper products. Thank you also to Doug and LaJean Wehring for providing a Thrivent Action Team that helped purchase all the vegies, chips, crackers, drinks and other items. Thank you to all who came and enjoyed and gave generously! The offerings for the soup suppers totaled \$2,062! Half of the offerings will be given to the Igumbilo Girls School and the other half will go to help support the AMCOS Project.

The Igumbilo Girls School currently needs help with a couple of projects. The school was hit by a derecho last December that damaged buildings and roofs. Fortunately the girls were on holiday break, so thankfully no one was hurt, but the damage needs to be repaired. The school has also asked for help in funding a worship space for the girls. Planning is underway and the synod is getting an estimate on the cost. The Western Iowa Synod supports the school each month with \$2,000 for scholarships to help those girls who otherwise could not attend. These funds help provide supplies, salaries for the staff, food and other essentials.

We also want to help support the AMCOS Project. There are 27 Agricultural Marketing Cooperative Societies (AMCOS) in the Southern Diocese and the Iringa Diocese in Tanzania. AMCOS cooperatives aggregate fertilizer, hybrid seed and other input supplies for cooperative members. By aggregating large purchases of supplies, members are assured of receiving quality products that they specify, on time, delivered to their villages.

They also provide the storage for the members produce while waiting for transporting them to the market. In each co-operative there is storage facility to keep safely the members' produce for the whole harvesting season before sending them to a processing firm and market them when a potential buyer with good price is found. In some cases, this provides as much as 40% more profit for the individual producer.

## May Stewardship News!



ELCA World Hunger is our mission for May. The ELCA is the nation's largest relief organization.

Through their work we have learned some very sobering facts:

\* 821 million people around the world can't access the food they need to survive.

That is 1 in every 10 people who can't access the food they need to survive.

- \*Recent estimates show 736 million, or 10% of the world population live in extreme poverty, that is they live on less the \$1.90 per day.
- \*2017 (the most recent year for information) found that 40 million people in the United States were unsure of where their next meal would come from.
- \*39.7 million Americans were living in poverty in 2017. That means that a family of four has an income of below \$25,094.

ELCA provides immediate relief to hunger but goes beyond that to connect people with the resources they need to produce the food and gain access to clean water, education, health care, and a source of income so long-term sustainable change can be made.

They do this by assisting and accompanying congregations, social ministry organizations, and grass roots community-based non-profits that address the needs of the people in key areas.

They offer services to aid community developments that address poverty, hunger and social injustice.

The ELCA World Hunger depends on volunteers across the ELCA to raise awareness, share a story, and promote this mission.
