November 21st will be our Consecration Sunday. We invite everyone to come to worship and offer their giving commitment card as part of worship!


### 2021 Poinsettia Order

Christina Gochenour, marketing director, says as of October 15<sup>th</sup> that the home is currently accepting visitors, however there are a few guidelines: visits must be scheduled by calling the front desk, 712-328-9500, 24 hours in advance. No more than two people per visit but there is no limit to the length of time. In the room, vaccinated visitors may have physical contact and not wear a mask. One must provide vaccination status with a copy of the card submitted to the facility either in-person or electronically. Visitor log and screening are required and following the PPE protocols throughout the facility irrespective of vaccination status. There is no limitation on visitors per day. We are so excited to see families again and are truly grateful for all of the support this last year and half. It means the world to us and to our residents. Thank you.

### THE PATTERN IN THE SEED

The harvest has begun! People have been waiting and watching for the signs that it's ready. They have been getting equipment prepared so they are set to go. Now, finally, they are busy gathering in the crop they have labored all year to grow.



There is a sense of purpose and excitement as field after field goes down before the combine. It is also a moment of truth. Will the promises and claims made by seed dealers last spring be fulfilled? Will the yield live up to expectations?

Though there are so many factors that can affect the growth of the seed the most important factor is in the seed itself. You need to plant good seed to have a good harvest. In his parables, Jesus used "seed" again and again as a symbol of the life God is giving to us.

I was struck again by the phrase in the hymn "Who Is This Host?" (ELW # 425), "See with new eyes the pattern in the seed." The pattern in the seed really is the basis by which people make decisions on which seed to plant and where to plant it. Past performance, how it responds to varying soil and weather conditions, the characteristics of the crop are all factors which must be considered. Yet with all their research, the farmer still doesn't really know how the crop will turn out until the harvest.

The pattern in the seed also makes me think about our lives. Jesus spoke about himself but also about us when he said, "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains only a single seed; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." (John 12:24)

We are seeds God has planted in particular places and in specific combinations. There is a pattern in our lives – certain gifts, abilities and characteristics given to us. The use of these qualities are part of the yield, the fruit that is born in our lives.

The conditions in which we grow may not always be ideal. Some of our characteristics that come to light may be negative. Nevertheless God, as the expert farmer, continues to work with the conditions and the seed, balancing them out to produce a good yield.

Sometimes we look at the yield in our lives and it does not seem to be very much to us. Sometimes we seem to be losing rather than gaining ground. Sometimes there does not even seem to be a pattern! In those times, we need to see with new eyes. We need to look from God's perspective.

God sees the beginning from the end. We can have confidence that God is at work cultivating, planting, rotating locations, fertilizing and watching over our lives. God sees the pattern and will bring us to harvest!

Next, the semi-annual meeting preparations were discussed and made.


The semi-annual meeting is scheduled for Sunday, October 17th in the fellowship hall.

Numerous activities with pumpkins included crafts, stories, counting, carving and science projects including measuring and cooking.
