#### Annual Tanzanian Auction Sunday, October 9th at 9 a.m.

The annual Tanzania Auction to support our Christian sisters and brothers in Kidugala will be held in the fellowship hall and treats will be served. In the past we have split the money raised between the Igumbilo Girl's School and the Kidugala SACCOS (Savings and Credit Cooperative Societies). They are both extremely important resources to make their lives better. In some cases the girl's school is a sanctuary that keeps the girls from being married as young as 13 or 14 years old in arranged marriages.

Here are a few items that have been made and donated so far: Shirley Chambers is donating several Sundays of altar flowers, several Sundays of fellowship refreshments, and some baked goods. You buy the item and she does all the work in your name. Glenrose Meier made a beautiful guilt and Coretta Andersen made a quilt from the old choir robes and they are hanging on the downstairs altar, Ken Andersen donated a handmade wooden atomic clock, and Ed Calkins made a three cross wooden hanging. On Labor Day weekend, my husband's family gathers at the family farm for a cookout. Each year, as we journey to the farm, we comment about the corn and bean fields along the way. One day they seem to make a lush, green carpet for miles. As we head home, it's like someone flipped a switch and we start to see patches of yellow. The changes happen quickly and before long, the plants in the ditch are changing colors. The trees start to turn and the world is ablaze with new beauty. Every time I venture out, I'm surprised with the changes. I'm thankful I live in a place where I get to witness the changing seasons. What a gift to see God's new creation every few months!

The changing landscape brings to mind Isaiah 40:8, which says, "The grass withers and the flowers fade, but the word of our God stands forever." This is definitely a time of transition. In my family, we're learning how to have three people in our house rather than four. Jackson left for college in August and life just feels different. After 21 years of serving in faith formation ministries, my role at church has a new iteration. I've finished grad school and my schedule will look different than it has the last two years. My daughter now has her license and doesn't need me to drive her around anymore.

St. Paul is in transition, too. Pastor Sharon has served with you this last year and now, you will have a new pastor. It will take time for us to get to know one another and learn what's important for each other as we think about God's work in the world.

In the midst of all the changes, I find peace in the consistency of God's word. No, I don't mean that there aren't changes in the Bible. We just have to look at different translations to know that changes are always happening. The New Revised Standard Version (NRSV), which many ELCA churches use, just got an update. Scholars are always reviewing original texts to try and comprehend meanings of words in ancient times. I think this work will continue until Jesus returns. When I say that God's word is consistent, I mean that every time I open it, I encounter God. The time I spend reading will help me to grow in relationship with God. I may read a verse I've read a thousand times and yet, experience something new that time. I may revisit a verse I've struggled with for years and this time, something clicks in my mind to tell me something new about God. Every time, God shows up. When so much around me changes, God still shows up. God sustains us and walks with us as we encounter life. Just as God cares for the creation, God also cares for us. I'm thankful that I get to live in a place that reminds me of this good news every day.

I look forward to joining you and getting to know each of you. I can't wait to see how God will continue to show up in all of the transitions.


