

#### **FALL START**

Are you ready for the plunge? It may not be officially fall yet, but the fall schedule is gearing up at full speed! There are so many possibilities for involvement at church as well as in school or in the community that it can be overwhelming. With Covid-19 and the Delta variant raising its ugly head, decisions on what to do and how to do it can get even more complicated and can take even longer. In the midst of all the activity, it can be easy to lose sight of our priorities, especially time for prayer and Bible-reading.

I was struggling with that issue. Busyness was taking over. My devotions were dry or none existent. It felt as if I was going through the motions. One night as I washed the dishes, (yes keeping up on housekeeping is another task on the To-Do list!) there were some sticky pans I needed to soak. When I came back later to wash them, the sticky, hardened food just floated off and with very little scrubbing, they were clean.

It occurred to me that my seemingly automatic motions of prayer and Bible-reading were like setting dirty pans to soak. It may not take long to pour water in the pan, but the water has its effect. Even though it is just sitting there and nothing seems to be happening, the water is softening and cleansing.

In the same way, when I take time to read and pray, even briefly, it is like soaking in God's word. While I am busy doing other things, God's living word/living water is working on the crusting accumulations of sin and guilt and indifference that build up in my life.

Soaking does not take the place of washing the dishes, just as Bible reading and prayer do not replace participating in worship. If you forget to soak a dirty pan it can still be washed. If you don't pray or read your Bible, God still washes you clean as you hear the Word and receive the Sacrament of Communion during worship.

Soaking, however, can ease the process. If you neglect to soak the pan, it may take steel wool and a lot of elbow grease, but that pan still can come clean. God's cleansing power is at work in you, whether it is with a dishcloth or a Brillo pad.

God desires that we mature and grow in our faith. In the busyness, when we feel depleted and brought down to dust, God's Word can revive us! Make it a priority to worship regularly. Take a morning or evening dip into God's Word. Plunge into a Bible study like the one starting in September. Soak in God's life-giving water and see the difference it can make in your busy, complicated life.

St. Paul Lutheran Church council met at 6:30 Tuesday August 17, 2021. All members were present.

Before the meeting was called to order the council met with Pastor Mike Kroona from the Synod via Zoom to discuss the next steps of the call process.

The meeting was called to order at 7:45.

The consent agenda was discussed. Erica moved to approve the consent agenda. Tracy seconded. The motion passed.

Under new business was discussion of the initial budget to be presented at the semi annual meeting. After some discussion it was decided to continue with a similar budget to last year with some increases to special accounts where it is needed due to Covid mitigations.

A reminder that Rally Day will be held Sunday September 12th. This will include a pancake breakfast, Sunday School activities, and a special outdoor church service. There will only be one service on Rally Day.

An update about the parsonage was given. A new family has moved in and will be renting for six months and then month to month after that if needed. Under unfinished business was the nominating committee. This will need to be finalized for the next meeting in order for it to be ready for the semi annual meeting.

Next was discussion about covid mitigations. We will continue the use of disposable communion cups and masks will continue to be optional as we keep an eye on community covid numbers.

An update about live streaming church services was next. Someone is coming in this week to set up the new system.

Then there was an update about the cement work for the lift. Someone from Harlan will be coming in this week to see what cement work needs to be done.

The next council meeting was set for Tuesday September 21st at 6:30.

#### August 2021 Call Update

Members of the Council were able to meet with a representative of the Western Iowa Synod to begin the process of calling a pastor following the hiring of Pastor Sharon as our Interim Pastor.

During the meeting with the Synod, the call process was outlined. The next step in the process is to put together a Call Committee. According to our By-Laws, the Call Committee is to be composed of nine voting members, of which one is a youth. Please take a moment to read the explanation of what it means to be a voting member bellow.

Council members will be reaching out to potential Call Committee members during the month of September and will be putting names forward to the Congregation for approval at the Semi-Annual meeting in October.

After the Call Committee convenes, they will meet with the Synod and begin collecting important information about our congregation to develop a profile that can be used to match us with a potential pastor.

Please continue to pray for our Council, our Call Committee, and Pastor Sharon as we navigate the call process. Please reach out to any of the Council members if you have questions or concerns!

#### **VOTING MEMBERS**

Questions about who is involved in the decision-making have arisen as St. Paul Lutheran seeks a new pastor. The Congregational Constitution specifies the framework for different parts of this process. Since this will include times of voting, it seemed this would be a good time to see how the constitution defines membership.

People often talk about active and inactive church members, but the Constitution uses different categories. They are: Baptized, Confirmed, Voting and Associate. This is what paragraph C8.02 of our constitution says:

#### **C8.02** Members shall be classified as follows:

**Baptized** members are those persons who have been received by the Sacrament of Holy Baptism in this congregation, or, having been previously baptized in the name of the Triune God, have been received by certificate of transfer from other Lutheran congregations or by affirmation of faith.

**Confirmed** members are baptized persons who have been confirmed in this congregation, those who have been received by adult baptism or by transfer as confirmed members from other Lutheran congregations, or baptized persons received by affirmation of faith.

**Voting** members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation.

Associate members are persons holding membership in other Christian congregations who wish to retain such membership but desire to participate in the life and mission of this congregation, or persons who wish to retain a relationship with this congregation while being members of other congregations. They have all the privileges and duties of membership except voting rights and eligibility for elected offices or membership on the Congregation Council of this congregation.

Thus, Voting members, those confirmed members who communed and contributed last year and this year, will be the ones able to vote on the issues.
